## Mr. Rakuzan Sono, 28th Headmaster of Seizangoryu

Born on September 21, 1945. Graduated from the Musashino Art University. In 1978 became 28th Headmaster of the Seizangoryu School. In 1988 he was in charge of the Emperor Showa Imperial funeral matters. In 1990 he served at the Imperial Court during the enthronement ceremony of the Emperor Akihito and the ceremonial offering of newly-harvested rice to the deities by the Emperor after his enthronement. Mr. Sono has published many books concerning Ikebana including; "Seizan Ikebana Photo Album", "Flower Smile" volume 1-4, "Seizangoryu Ikebana Tebikigusa" part 1 & 2 which were reprinted few times.

Looking at flowers, the ancient people felt the transition of seasons and learned the time of seeding as well as the time of appearance of fish. Plants were used for food, medicine, clothes and timber, before an object of pleasure. Plants were the object of worship because of their benefits. It was a great luxury to use flowers only for pleasure. The culture of Ikebana was born among those who were allowed to enjoy this luxury.

Motouji Sono(1210-1282) was the fouder of Sonoke family and a courtier. Then he and his descendants took posts as Dainagon, Chunagon so on. He and his descendants lived in a world of elegance close to the emperor and experiencing manners, traditional events and ceremonies. They transferred the spirits of these elegant matters into the form of flower arrangement. In the late of Edo era, Seizangoryu, which was also called "Flower of the Sonos", "Flowers in the Court", and "Noble School of the Sonos", came to be widely known as an elegant and refined school. At present, Seizangoryu inherits an essence of Japanese culture by preserving a ceremony to offer flowers to the gods.

### Mr. Motohiro Sono, Designate of Seizangoryu



Born in 1975 he graduated from the Waseda University,he started to study of the Ikebana at the age of 10. Served at Meiji Shrine as the Shinto Priest for 5 years.
